He has performed in a variety of events, some of the latest being AZAA's scene festival where he performed a scene from *Stupid F*cking Bird* by Aaron Posner, East Valley Yamaha Music School's Ensemble Concert at Chandler Center for the Arts where he sang in a medley from Stephen Schwartz's *Wicked*, and the debut show of Spicy Meatball, an improv troupe of which he is a founding member. Supported by his incredible & talented wife Rachel, along with an amazing community of other artists, Andrew has no plans to stop throwing himself into new creative endeavours any time soon.



A 76-year-old author, screenwriter and retired psychologist, **Doc Taylor** goes to AZAA for playtime. She loves performing Shakespeare and comedies that make people laugh. Doc apologizes to the family animals who run for cover when she rehearses Shakespeare. Doc is grateful to her husband, who supports her acting hobby. Doc's children and grandchildren are inspired by her love of theater and acting.



Daniel Jurado has been an active member of AZAA for a little over 7 months now. He has dreamed of becoming an actor ever since he was a child and hopes to make this dream a reality. He is also enrolled in a Shakespeare class with Brandy Hotchner and has found another passion in the art of Shakespeare.



Danniel Giraldo is a classically trained actor, guitarist and singer-songwriter with a dynamic range across off-off-Broadway, opera, film, and immersive theatre. He studied Musical Theater at AMDA and Opera at New World School of the Arts, as well as training under Brandy Hotchner, Kristen Cerreli, and Tony-winner Randy Graff. His stage work includes Marco in A View from the Bridge (Off-Broadway), Guglielmo in Cosi Fan Tutte, Monty in A Gentleman's Guide to Love and Murder, Peter in Company, and Al in A Chorus Line. He's performed in experimental works like Once Upon a Palooza and Square Dance at the Guggenheim Museum, and on screen in Fed, Without a Stage (Paris Cinema Award), Mr. Hialeah, Till We Meet Again, and Corazón City. A skilled guitarist and vocalist, he's played 54 Below and Nashville, writes original music that blends raw

storytelling with cinematic Flair and has written plays.


